The first edition of Building the Knowledge Management Network by Cliff Figallo and Nancy Rhine is one of the very few attempts that deliver on all its promises of containing Best Practices, Tools and Techniques, that are contemporary, practical and reliable. It is easily, not only one of the best books on the subject, owing to its conversational and instructional style, but also a fairly complete collection of insights of learnings from many pioneering efforts of online communities and conversations that boardrooms can learn from.
